News

- According to the Ministry Of Public Health 280,075 foreigners including 5667 British Nationals have now received a COVID-19 vaccine.
- The CCSA continues to reiterate that Thailand's vaccine strategy is to ensure all foreign nationals living in Thailand will be given access to vaccines in accordance with the national vaccination campaign.
- The UK has donated 415000 doses of AstraZeneca vaccine to Thailand. This donation will go into Thailand's national vaccination programme, where it will help ensure vulnerable people of all nationalities in Thailand are vaccinated. More information can be found [here](#).
- NHS COVID Passes/Vaccine Passports are currently not available for people who have been vaccinated outside of the UK. The UK government however recognises it needs to consider how to treat British Nationals who have been vaccinated overseas. Work is ongoing to determine which non-UK vaccines may be recognised.
- There have been some problems with protection of personal data on Ministry of Public Health websites. If you have any concerns about your personal data, you should contact the Ministry Of Public Health directly. If you have evidence that your personal data has been shared without your consent, you can report this to the Royal Thai Police or the [Technology Crime Suppression Division](#)
- The CCSA has confirmed that foreigners in Thailand should not contact their Embassy to register for a vaccine. If a hospital advises you to contact the Embassy to register you should explain this to them.

Registration For Vaccines

- The Ministry of Foreign Affairs in conjunction with the Ministry of Public Health launched a new [website](#) on 1st August for foreigners over the age of 18 to register for their first vaccine. Once registered you will receive confirmation of the date and location of your vaccine.

Vaccinations will be allocated in accordance with Thai government priorities.

- Anyone who had registered for a vaccine at BangSue Grand Station will have their registration details automatically transferred to the new Ministry Of Public Health [website](#)
- Chulabhorn Royal Academy will open registration for Sinopharm vaccination at **10:10am on 4th August** via this [website](#) and the CRA SINOP application (available on iOS and Android). The cost will be 1554THB for both doses. Successful applicants must make payment before **6pm on 6th August**. Registration is expected to be open every Wednesday, depending on quantities available.
- Most private hospitals outside Bangkok have closed registration for the Moderna vaccine. Anyone who has already registered should monitor the hospital website for more information

- The Ministry of Public Health advises that foreign nationals of all age groups living outside the high-risk areas of Bangkok, Samut Prakan, Samut Sakhon, Pathum Thani, Nontaburi and Nakorn Pathom can register for a vaccine at a hospital that holds their medical records. You must present your passport, proof of residence such as visa/work permit, appointment confirmation or medical certificate.
- British Nationals who are at least 60 years old with one of 7 stated chronic illnesses and all employees of British Chamber of Commerce Thailand member companies operating in dark red zones can register interest to receive a vaccine via this website

Bangkok

If you are over the age of 60, living with any of the 7 stated chronic illnesses or pregnant (more than 12 weeks gestation) you can pre-register for a vaccine at the following hospitals:

Phuket

You can register for vaccinations in Phuket via the [Phuket Win](#) website. You will need to provide evidence that you live in Phuket. For more information call the Phuket Provincial Health Office hotline on 0945938876 and 0622435116 or via Line @phuketwin.

Chiang Mai

You can register for a vaccine in Chiang Mai by downloading an application form from the Chiang Mai Provincial Office [website](#) or directly [here](#). For more information contact the Chiang Mai Provincial Health Office www.chiangmaihealth.go.th or the Consular Co-ordinator Ben Svasti Thomson via email covidcommcm@gmail.com

- Vaccinations for the over 70s are being held until 6th August at [Vaccination Centre McCormick Hospital](#). You will receive Sinovac as your first vaccine with AstraZeneca administered as your second dose 3-4 weeks later.

• **Hua Hin**

If you live in Hua Hin you can register for a vaccine via [Mor Prachub Prom](#). You may need to contact Hua Hin Hospital to modify your passport number to 13-digit ID number to allow registration on the application. Once registered, which may take up to one day, you can reserve a vaccine on this [website](#). For more information, contact [Hua Hin Hospital](#)

• **Koh Samui / Koh Phangan / Koh Tao**

You can register for a vaccine at Koh Samui hospital until 6th August for vaccination on 8th August. To register, you will need to provide the following documents:

1. A copy of your passport
2. House rental agreement with house owners ID, signed by the owner
3. Non-Thai ID card (Koh Samui only)
4. Work permit
5. Bank book
6. A certificate from your employer or local hospital

• **Chonburi**

You can register for a Covid-19 vaccine in Chonburi by completing a registration form. Each district has a different link to register. More details can be found on [Chonburi Provincial Public Health Office](#) social media.

If you are over the age of 60, have one of the 7 listed [underlying health conditions](#) or pregnant women more than 12 weeks gestation can pre-register for a vaccine at Samithvej Sriracha Hospital, Chonburi via this [website](#)

• **Khon Kaen**

You can register for a vaccine via your main district public hospital or at Srinagarind Khon Kaen hospital, Regional health Promotion Centre 7 and Khon Kaen hospital.

If you are over the age of 60, have one of the 7 listed [underlying health conditions](#) or pregnant women more than 12 weeks gestation can pre-register for a vaccine at Bangkok-Khon Kaen Hospital via this [website](#)

• **Buriram**

If you have a pink ID card you can register via the MorProm app or your local hospital. If you do not have a pink ID card, you can register with your local hospital. You will need to take a copy of your passport, address in Thailand and contact details. We have been assured that the vaccination schedule has been arranged on a first-come first-served basis.

• **KamphaengPhet**

We have been advised by the Provincial Public Health Office that foreigners are able to register for vaccine at any public hospital in Kamphaengphet Province.

If you are employed in Kamphaengphet Province your employer may be able to register on your behalf. You should therefore speak directly with your employer.

• **Sa Kaeo**

You can register for a vaccine by contacting the eligibility verification unit at Sa Kaeo Crown Prince Hospital with the following documents:

1. Your passport
2. ID card of your spouse (if not married, the house owners ID can be used)
3. Marriage certificate
4. House registration book
5. Letter explaining that you are currently residing in Sa Kaeo
6. Social security card

Rayong

If you live in Rayong you can register for vaccine via <https://ระยองสู้โควิด.com>. You can receive the vaccine at one of these 6 hospitals:

1. Rayong hospital
2. Memorial Hospital Sirindhorn
3. Banchang hospital
4. Klaeng Hospital
5. Wang Chan Hospital
6. Ban Khai hospital

Ubon Ratchathani

If you live in Ubon Ratchathani you can register for a vaccine by taking your passport to the Vaccine Registration Centre on the first floor at Ubon Ratchathani Provincial Health Office.
